## **Lakeside Cemetery**

Lakeside Cemetery is located on the East side of Route 287. It was first incorporated on February 5, 1880. The first burial was that of Mrs. Matthew Burnett on Feb 22, 1880. About fifty burials were moved here from the Old Saint Louis Cemetery in 1884. Lakeside also contains the grave of the first white woman to die in Larimer County; Mrs. Moses (Emily) Markley. She died sometime after 1860. Other burials of people who died before 1860 and were subsequently reinterred at Lakeside include H. L. W. Peterson and Mexican Joe.

Early records of this cemetery were casually kept. Many inconsistencies were found when the information from the tombstones was matched with the master list.

The update to this volume included a complete check of all tombstones and cemetery records.

In addition to the deceased name we have tried to include, grave location, birth date, death date, and any other information of genealogical significance. When we were unable to find information we left the field blank. There are many infants that according to the records have no given name.

Of special concern are woman's surnames. We recognized that there were many cases where the tombstone did not accurately reflect the legal surname at the time of death. We decided to use the surname from the lot records, theses are the names from the burial permit and should be the legal name.


